## **EAGLE TEAM HIGHLIGHTS:**

**Robotics - Lego Competition at IHS:** Issaquah High School's robotics team, the Issaquah Robotics Society, was excited hosted a FIRST Lego League (FLL) competition on 12/15. 35 teams of students in 4<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> grade (about 250 total) from BLMS, PCMS, Cascade Ridge, Clark, Cougar Ridge, Discovery & Endeavor (and their families!) descended on IHS to give presentations on their research into STEM topics and compete with autonomous Lego Mindstorm robots that they had built. IHS students filled most of the seventy volunteer positions needed to run the event. We would especially like to recognize Seniors Sophia Mularoni (referee), John Morse (referee), Yenni Jun (judge), Aedan Henry (judge), and sophomores Alexandra Mohn (pits coordinator) and Amita Prabhala (event organizer and master of ceremonies). In addition to running the competition, IHS robotics students have been helping coach FLL teams at Clark Elementary, Cougar Ridge Elementary, and Pacific Cascade Middle School since the beginning of the school year.

**2020 Competition Game Revealed**: The 2020 FIRST robotics competition will be at Glacier Peak HS in Snohomish on the 29<sup>th</sup> of February and March 1<sup>st</sup>. We're very excited to join almost 4,000 teams around the world who will be participating in this competition. Highlights from this year's game include shooting goals with a 7-inch diameter Nerf ball and hanging multiple robots from a swinging bar that hangs about 6 feet in the air, while keeping the bar balanced.

**Boys Basketball** – Varsity Boys won 2 of their last 3 games with solid road victories over Richland and Newport. Charlie Dietiker (28 points) and Danny Howe (34 points) both had career highs vs the Bombers and Knights respectively. Tim Crandall had 10+ assists in each win, and Andrew Mattson hit three threes vs. Richland. Senior Adam Liske has added some nice minutes off the bench. JV Boys won two of three games this week to move their record to 5-4. On Monday, they pulled away late at home to beat Arlington 58-51 and followed that with a 65-55 win at Newport on Friday. Chase Dietiker (17) and Tate Smith (13) led the effort. Despite leading for the first 3 quarters, the team lost at Skyline 63-56 on Saturday night. Mason Muir (14) and Toby Keeler (10) were the top scorers.



**Girls Basketball -** The Issaquah Varsity girls moved to 8-3 overall and first place in the Crest Division (4-1) with road wins over Newport and Skyline. At Newport, balanced scoring included 14 points each from Lauren Frueh, Alivia Stephens, and Keira Hanson. Katie MacNary also registered double-digit rebounds. Five different players (Cam Gibson, Erin Schobbe, Shea Dillon, Keira Hanson, and Lauren Frueh) hit threes in a dominating 56-21 win over the Spartans. Hanson led the team with 13 points. Gibson and Stephens each had 9. Overall, nine different players scored for Issaquah. The JV girls team is also rocking the league with a record of 8-2 after this week's games against Newport (58-53) and Skyline (56-21). Go Eagles!
